ABOUT THE DEVELOPMENT RESOURCE CENTRE

The Development Resource Centre [DRC] is a not-for-profit, non-government, charitable trust with a voluntary governance board. The DRC provides specialist information and education services in Aotearoa New Zealand focused on development and global issues. It is core funded by NZAID Nga Hoe Tuputupu-mai-tawhiti (The New Zealand Agency for International Development).

The DRC's work is guided at all times by a set of core values which recognise that development must be people-centred, holistic and sustainable.

The DRC consists of two programmes, Dev-Zone and the Global Education Centre [GEC]:

Dev-Zone's work is grounded in Aotearoa New Zealand, focuses on the Pacific and provides coverage of development in the rest of the world. It has information from a range of perspectives on global issues including human rights, fair trade, globalisation and gender and development. You can access this information through:

- Dev-Zone's library which is open to the public and has a unique collection of books, journals, annual reports, hard-to-get videos/DVDs and reference material
- Dev-Zone's website which a constantly updated range of online resources including articles, reports and websites, and email bulletins.
- Dev-Zone's staff who are qualified information and development professionals that can answer quick queries free of charge or undertake in-depth information searches and literature reviews at reasonable rates.

The Global Education Centre (GEC) provides services surrounding Global Education to the formal and informal education sectors in Aotearoa New Zealand and builds capacity to include global awareness into their programmes.

- The Schools Programme provides resources and training for teachers, teacher trainees and students. Services include the provision of workshops, Global Issues magazine, fact sheets on a range of countries and global institutions, and resource kits based on the Aotearoa NZ curriculum.
- The Community Youth Programme provides services that support youth workers and young people in the community including youth worker resources, a youth driven website (www.justfocus.org.nz), training for youth workers and community educators, and workshops and support for young people.
